

Some time ago, I went through a season of several years in which the prayer of Moses in Psalm 90:14 formed a **part of my morning, daily "meeting with Jesus" time. It is** a single-verse prayer that takes on even more meaning the deeper one goes with it.

Psalm 90:14

O satisfy us in the morning with Your lovingkindness, That we may sing for joy and be glad all our days.

Addressed to God, it is a request for satisfaction. Satisfaction and fulfillment from Him. His satisfaction and joy.

The specific content of this satisfaction, where it comes from, is unique: "Your lovingkindness." It might sound like just a common, vanilla version of love, but it is so much more. This Hebrew word, *hesed*, may be the single most theologically profound concept in the entire Old Testament. It is translated multiple ways throughout the Old Testament not because we do not know what it means, but because it means so much. One understanding is *covenant love*. This unique, committed love that God has for us *will never end* because it is grounded in who He is and not what we do.

This *satisfying love* hooked a memory, from forty years ago, of a comment from my church history professor at Dallas Theological Seminary, Dr. Edwin Deibler. He said, **"The following statement is not inspired Scripture, but it may come as close as anything penned by man. 'What is** the chief end of man? The chief end of man is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever.'" He quoted from the Westminster Shorter Catechism. What stood out to me is **"to enjoy"** God. Even those 17th century theologues recognized the innate longing of the human heart – even my heart – to quest after joy, fulfillment, satisfaction. Pastor John Piper further clarifies by offering one tiny **word change in that classic statement: "The chief end of** man is to glorify God <u>BY</u> enjoying Him forever." Do you enjoy the Lord?

Tie this thought into our verse - *O satisfy us in the morning with Your lovingkindness* = Let me find and experience my true satisfying joy in the reality of You, O God.

Let's get practical. How do we do this? One way is to corral my wild and straying thoughts every morning with the rope of God's Word and specifically pull them to one of the "covenant promises" that is mine all because of Jesus.

I can do all things through Him who strengthens me, Philippians 4:13.

I am with you always, Matthew 28:20.

Always [abound] in the work of the Lord [even today!], <u>knowing</u> that your toil is not in vain in the Lord, 1Corinthians 15:58.

Nineteenth-century Christian leader George Mueller said it is our first business of the day to get our own soul happy in Jesus. Even when life is hard and disappointing, and pain and aches are real, Psalm 90:14 can be one track to run on in this endeavor.

O satisfy us [this] morning with Your lovingkindness,

That we may sing for joy and be glad [this] day.

2017 SALES TAX HOLIDAY

Arkansas will hold its annual sales tax holiday, beginning Saturday, August 5, 2017 at 12:01 a.m. and ending Sunday, August 6, 2017 at 11:59 p.m. State and local sales tax will not be collected during this 48-hour period on the sale of: (1) Clothing and footwear if the sales price is less than one hundred dollars (\$100) per item; (2) Clothing accessories and equipment if the sales price is less than fifty dollars (\$50) per item; (3) School supplies; (4) School art supplies; and (5) School instructional materials.
