One side effect of the information glut can be a numbing disinterest. The changes we have witnessed in our generation are truly historically unprecedented. My grandmother, whom I remember very clearly, could never have imagined that a person sitting in the comfort of her own recliner could check the current weather where every grandchild lives, catch up on the latest news, watch the St. Louis Cardinals and see a favorite movie – all within the same one hour period, all from the same chair. We have access to more and more, faster and faster; and if nothing else, it can all provide alluring distraction.

As we often say around VBC, the main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing. And in our Lord's priorities, *people* are primary. Every person will live forever in one of two eternal destinations.

Remember that one's spiritual diagnosis is not determined by his social appearance. To some in this wonderful place of Hot Springs Village, it seems beyond belief that anyone with such class, distinction or helpfulness could possibly be headed for an eternal hell. But Bible teacher of the mid-twentieth century, Donald Grey Barnhouse, used to say as he spoke to "up and in-ners" (rather than down-and-outers): "Satan doesn't care if you are immorally degraded or morally upright as long as you are without Jesus. You can go to hell just as easily being a nice person as being a sullied person."

David lamented, "No man cared for my soul," in Psalm 142:5 (KJV). It can be tempting to become complacent when it comes to the eternal destiny of those around us. Aren't you glad that someone cared for you and your eternal soul? Jesus is often described in the Gospels as being "full of compassion." And God's "A" method is to wrap His care in the arms of people, like us.

A friend was trying to get his golfing buddy interested in spiritual things, and asked, "Hey Joe! Do you know where sinners go?" "Yeah, I know," Joe grudgingly obliged, "sinners go to hell." "No," replied his spiritually concerned friend, "they go to church."

Just as a journey of a thousand miles starts with a first step, so a journey into eternity in heaven can start with a single question: Will you join me at church this Sunday? Now, you know that sitting in church won't make your friend a Christian any more than sitting in your garage will make you a car! But sitting in a garage can be a good place to learn about cars; and coming to church can be an excellent place to learn about Jesus and His heaven.

Over the years at Village Bible Church, I've had a number of people express something like this to me: I hadn't really attended church since I was young. I was pretty hesitant about coming. But I have to tell you, I've been surprised. It's not at all like I remember or thought it would be. For the first time I'm starting to understand a bit about the Bible, and even look forward to coming to church!

And often it began with a simple question: Will you join me at church this Sunday?

Remember: All you can take to heaven ... is a friend.

So, Who cares? We do. And I believe you do also.

And it can start with something as simple as a question: Will you join me at church this Sunday? Stay tuned for more helps as to how our **Each One** Can Bring One emphasis unfolds in the weeks ahead.



April 16 - 8:30 am & 10:30 am



And, once again, Corrie realized that it was for the souls of the brutal Nazi guards that her sister prayed.

BILL & MARIE MASON





Giving to VBC



Day by day and week after week, the ministry of Village Bible Church continues. The Bible is held high, many are taught, sermons are preached, fellowship is developed, missionaries are supported, and so much more. All of this is made possible by the regular gifts of God's people who count Village Bible Church their church home. About \$79,000 per month is required to keep the lights on and the ministries operating. If you ever have a question about the best place to designate your gift, the general fund is usually a wise choice.

In the past, Congress generally waited until December every year to extend the law that allows people to make a tax free donation of up to \$100,000 from their IRA, leaving some to scramble to make the contribution before the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) deadlines. But Congress made the law permanent last year, so if you're 70½ or older, you can transfer your 2017 (RMD) to charity at any time. If you have questions, be sure to contact the office staff and we'll get you in touch with the right folks.

God continues to bless the ministries of VBC and we are grateful for the long-standing tradition of generosity of our church family. We pray that God would continue to be honored and exalted through the VBC family in 2017, and beyond.


We will be talking about the "power of one."
